Direct services

As part of our work with partners on the Island, NSPCC Jersey provides a range of specialist services for children and families impacted by sexual abuse and sexual harm.

Letting the Future In (LTFI)

LTFI helps children and young people who have experienced sexual abuse rebuild their lives. We accept referrals for children and young people aged between 4 and 17-years-old so that they can recover from the impact abuse has had on

their lives. We can support children or young people with learning disabilities up until the age of 19. Parents and carers are critical to the child or young person's recovery, so we work with them to help them support their child.

Letting the Future In Siblings (LTFIS)

LTFIS supports the siblings of those children who have been sexually abused. We are increasingly aware that when sexual abuse has been

disclosed, there will be impact for all family members, so we're very pleased to be able to extend this service to include other children within the family.



Turn the Page

Turn the Page helps children and young people who have displayed harmful sexual behaviour and supports their families and their professional network. There are a range of assessment and intervention options for children and young

people between the ages of 4 and 17. This programme works with those children and the safe adults in their lives to address their needs, wider safeguarding concerns, and prevent further harm.



Awareness raising

With support from our NSPCC colleagues, and by working in partnership with other services on the Island, our team are doing important awareness raising work to help prevent child sexual abuse.

Speak out Stay safe (SOSS)

Our SOSS assemblies and workshops teach age-appropriate content so 5-11-year-olds can learn about abuse and what to do if they are worried. This programme is delivered by volunteers to children in

primary schools; teaching them how to recognise abuse and neglect, empowering them to speak out if they are worried about anything. You can visit our NSPCC Learning page to find out more.





Campaigns

We campaign to increase public awareness of sexual abuse so that children, young people, adults and professionals feel more confident identifying

concerns and where to seek support if needed. We deliver campaigns like PANTS, and an online safety campaign we co-created with professionals and parents in Jersey.
